There are lots of stories about ghosts and other supernatural creatures in the forest – but the forest is still a popular place for walking. Mount Fuji is very popular with climbers – about 300,000 people climb the volcano every year. They usually do it in July or August. It's better to climb at night because then you get to the top when the sun is coming up. It's a very beautiful view. From October to May, the climb is more dangerous because the weather is much worse.
